V. Equipment and Physical Facilities

Carpet installation has been completed. The two-week long project went very well and we've gotten a lot of positive comments about the refreshed look of the children's area. Library staff worked very hard to move tens of thousands of books onto carts so the shelves could be moved and the new carpet installed. It was also quite an effort on the part of the staff to reshelve all the books at the end of the project.

Bibliotheca sent a tech out to fix the sorter diverter and the repair was completed.

Summer Reading Program

Youth services is looking forward to implementing a few changes and simplifications we hope will improve this year's program. For the reading program, all kids ages 0 - 11 will receive the same paper reading record when they register. Instead of tracking books or minutes, they will mark off each day they read on a calendar. This encourages a daily reading habit and is more equitable to those who aren't stronger readers. Coupons and a free book are earned when kids have read a total of 25 and 50 days.

In another effort to simplify the program and minimize the disappointment many kids feel at the end of the summer, we won't be doing a grand prize drawing this year. This \$1000 savings will be used for other prizes and books.

Volunteer applications opened up a few weeks ago for our teen summer reading volunteers, who hand out coupons and free books to kids. We've had about 50 sign up so far.
